SUPERVISOR WEHRHEIM: Ladies and Gentlemen be mindful, we will strictly enforce the three-minute rule as a matter of fairness so, when the warning goes off be mindful that you have one-minute left and we would ask you to please wrap up your comments. Thank you very much.

TOWN CLERK: Peter Hanson.

PETER HANSON, 47 CYPRESS PINES DRIVE, NESCONSET: Good evening, my name is Peter Hansen a forty-year resident of Nesconset. I'm here to discuss the potential traffic hazards which will soon arise at the corner of Rosevale Avenue and Smithtown Boulevard. A brand new Cumberland facility is going up with eighteen pumps. Right now, Rosevale Avenue is six lanes, three lanes north and three lanes south. We need to know what the cutouts will be and in what direction vehicles will be allowed to egress from that location. If they are allowed to make a left turn onto Rosevale Avenue, heading south, at the same time as people coming out of a home development right across the street and some of them will be making lefts to go north on Rosevale Avenue, diagonally right across from one another. So, we need someone there to view what could happen to prevent any serious accidents. By the way, the posted speed limit on Rosevale Avenue is 40 MPH. Right now, there are no barriers on Rosevale Avenue. The rated congestion is "F", it can't get higher. We expect certainly increased traffic on that corner. The traffic on Smithtown Boulevard heading east and west at that location is also rated "F", especially in the morning hours and in the evening hours. One of the cutouts is on Smithtown Boulevard and again which direction will cars leaving Cumberland Farms be permitted to turn? Making a left on Smithtown Boulevard, heading west, again extremely heavy congestion and it's going to create problems. Heading east not as much, but again, traffic is extremely heavy. Going south on Gibbs Pond Road which crosses over to Rosevale the traffic backs up about a half a mile in the morning trying to get across Smithtown Boulevard. How are those people if they want to go into that Cumberland Farms, what will be their way of getting into that location? I would appreciate it if someone could go there as soon as the place opens

SUPERVISOR WEHRHEIM: Mr. Hansen, your time is up. But, what we will do Sir, Councilwoman Inzerillo is the Liaison to the Traffic Department, she made all those notes and we are going to talk to our Traffic Director and she will get back to you with his answers.

PETER HANSON: Thank you very much.

KRISTY MALKASIA, 18 PEONY LANE, COMMACK: I'm here once again to talk about the Animal Shelter. I watched Tuesday's Town Board Work Session on Video. <Inaudible 29:34> when John Ballantyne told you that there were twelve dogs at the Shelter. The website only has three up for adoption. I said to myself, "huh", either John Ballantyne is making up nine dogs or the Shelter website is not being updated. When he then told you that they were all medium sized dogs and hedged on the average number of dogs ranging from six to eight or eight to twelve. I realized he might be lying to you, but that seems impossible. When another volunteer called me, and said she just got off the phone with the Shelter and there are only three dogs, I had a good laugh. Frankenstein's monster is alive and well. See, John Ballantyne is your creation, each and every one of you. As far back as 2002 there were rumors and out right complaints by his employees of fear and retribution, including demotions. As noted in this sixteen-year-old news article. I'm going to read this to you. "Retired Fire Marshall, Fred Clepsaddle said that as former union representative he heard complaints against Ballantyne from employees too frightened of reassignments to file grievances. It's just people are fed up now and they're starting to stand up. Said Clepsaddle, 63 of Kings Park." Well, its 2018 and nobody is standing up, which is what he wants. Anyway, was he disciplined? Of course not, he was promoted and given more power, becoming the second highest paid employee on the Town payroll. Now here we are in 2018 and he's graduated to terrorizing women at an Animal Shelter and lying to all of you. The people who pay him and the people he allegedly works for. I'd like to say it's the other way around, given your sheepishness and support of his tactics with Councilwoman Inzerillo actively helping him bully your employees. Ballantyne and his tiny kingdom in the smallest town on Long Island seems to relish his reputation as a feared ruler. Like smoking on airplanes and leaded gasolines, we now know this management style is ridiculous, wrong and outdated. In 2018, he'd be a laughing stock in any place else. In Smithtown, he's given a \$34,000.00 a year raise, oversight of an Animal Shelter he clearly knows nothing about and more employees to bully as he's done since 2002. Now he is flat out lying to the Town Board on video while he and Councilwoman Inzerillo continue planning. I wasn't going to speak about what Kris mentioned but, Mr. Ambrose in the Smithtown News had mentioned that there were seven dogs and I went to the website and I only saw three dogs too. So, there is definitely some information, misinformation on that. And, last year you did a wonderful job on the Facebook page, you did the Easter thing; I'm begging you guys, can you please put the Facebook page back up.

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: It's been up for about two or three months.

JOHN URBANCIK: That's the webpage.

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: It's on Facebook.

JOHN URBANCIK: Yeah, but Facebook leads you to a webpage. If you go there you can't, there's no share button to share.

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: You can share the page.

JOHN URBANCIK: If you want to share an individual animal, and let's say that there is a dog that's lost and you guys happen to have it in your Shelter, you can't post, "This dog is here."

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: I believe it is much more positive to share the page where you get the website and you don't see one animal you see all the animals.

JOHN URBANCIK: Okay, we can disagree on that, that's fine. The other thing I want to bring up is that, Lisa you love the animals, you made a good effort last year. In your position you can have static, there is always going to be somebody unhappy. We need a sprinkler system put in there. God forbid there is a fire and the animals burn because the Fire Department can't get there in time. It's not even an expensive thing. Mr. Lohan you had raised \$7,500.00 for the agility costs, I think it's more important that we have a sprinkler system in there. I mean God forbid this happens, that there's a fire and some of the animals are burned there. That is unacceptable and in the past, some of you have mentioned, Mr. Vecchio, we're going to have a state of the art Animal Shelter, a model Shelter and not having a sprinkler system in is just not right. I spoke to one of the Fire Marshalls, I don't remember his name, he told me we were grandfathered in and the building is pre- whatever that law was. So, we're doing the minimum for the animals instead of extra. This is a necessity. God forbid this happens, this is going to come back. I spoke publicly, a sprinkler system, we don't even have to answer to nobody. The Fire Marshall, we had the Parks Department, just run some pipes, put some sprinkler heads, put a heat sensor in there. I'm insistent on this. Please, it's not even about money and if it is about money, let me know and I'll do a "Go Fund Me" and I'll raise that money. That's all. Thank you very much for your time.

SUPERVISOR WEHRHEIM: Thank you.

JOHN DONEGAN, 66 FISHER ROAD, COMMACK: John Donegan, 66 Fisher Road, Commack, New York. Tonight, I came here to thank Lisa Inzerillo for her leadership for the public safety, she basically helped me with "Dead End" signs and she should be commemorated for that because as public safety on Fisher Road and Parkway Drive North. Thank you Mrs. Inzerillo. We have a problem with Elmont Park we had possibly a gang related matter and that's on Maria Crescent the neighbors are concerned about modification for Leland's to be cut back and they are concerned about lighting. I believe Mr. Wehrheimer you were addressing that.

SUPERVISOR WEHRHEIM: That's correct.

JOHN DONEGAN: We have another situation on Fisher Road, we have neighbors having seizures and hitting trees. What's happening, we have signs that say, "Children at Play." Public safety, okay, is really basically, I would say challenged now because children play in the street with the elderly and the disabled driving cars they could be in danger. Can we change in Ordinance and how do I do that?

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: What's the intersection?

JOHN DONEGAN: Fisher Road, down Fisher Road.

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: All of Fisher Road?

JOHN DONEGAN: It's down by 36th maybe in that range of numbers. So, those are the issues I wanted to address again. Thank you again Mr. Inzerillo, you really met with me, you really made a difference and you should be commemorated. You have done the Easter benefit you accepted my donations and John Urbancik's donations and you also accepted Kendrik Lawes and the doctors. Can we participate in an Easter charity like you did last year? Would you be doing that again?

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: It's not planned right now because there is going to be a lot of exterior renovation during the Easter time.

JOHN DONEGAN: Can we do it at Hoyt's Farm?

COUNCILWOMAN INZERILLO: That's something I'd have to look into.

JOHN DONEGAN: Thank you so much, have a good evening. Let's stay dry.

SUPERVISOR WEHRHEIM: Thank you.

JONATHAN ARTZ, 63 NEW MILL ROAD, SMITHTOWN: Good evening, my name is Jonathan Artz, I live on New Mill Road in Smithtown. The issue that has come to my attention recently is in regard to this cell phone tower, this proposed cell phone tower. My understanding is that this is to be put up across from the Stop and Shop shopping center on Main Street in Smithtown. In speaking with some of my fellow residents, both in person and through social media, it's my understanding that some people believe that this cell phone tower will resolve problems with regards to these dark areas in the town of Smithtown, but I'm not certain that it will resolve. I understand that there is a public safety issue in regard to 911 calls and alike not getting where they need to go, which is an important consideration I think we can all agree that needs to be addressed, it is a problem. My question is, I don't know if this 120-ft. cell tower is the answer to it. There's been some discussion about perhaps there being another option or other options either where to locate it or place smaller repeaters in other locations versus having a 120-ft cell tower that as visitors come in to the town of Smithtown they pass the "Welcome to Smithtown" sign and one of the first things that they'll see is the brand new 120-ft Smithtown cell tower. My opinion is that Smithtown should not look more like an industrial park it should look less like an industrial park to the extent that we can make this less apparent, I think that would be a good thing. Obviously, we want to attract visitors and new residents to the town of Smithtown and I don't know that 120-ft cell tower is the kind of revitalization vision that we all have for the town in the future. I know that we do have a vision for it, I don't know if 120-ft cell tower fits within that vision. So, in as much as we have a problem and we need to fix it rather than looking for the most expedient way let's say, to address the problem, perhaps this is considered to be the most expedient way, perhaps we can find another way that is smart growth, makes sense, that deals with the problem at hand and everyone can get behind and is consistent with what I think we all want to see as far as Smithtown's future its revitalization and what I think will attract more people to come and visit us, we'll attract people to want to live here and to pay taxes here quite frankly. Thank you very much for your time.

AL GANGLER, 3 BREEZY HOLLOW, ST. JAMES: Good evening my name is Al Gangler, 3 Breezy Hollow in St. James. I'm also here to bring up the issues with the cell tower. I just recently became aware of it. I'm not sure if there's available information because if you go online it's very difficult to find out except for Newsday articles and stuff like that. But, I live right down the road from a cell tower that's on the property of Head of the Harbor and I walk there, yet the signal in my house is very weak. It's all based on terrain, its not the only issue but it has a lot to do with it and putting 120-ft. tower may not resolve the issues that the residents think they're going to get resolved. They have an antenna at Landing Golf Course when people are complaining that they are getting calls to Connecticut instead of Smithtown. I doubt if that's really true because if you stand on the beach, at Long Beach you're going to reach Connecticut. You're not going to get a Smithtown tower you're just going to shoot across the Sound. So, I'm not sure where all the data is coming from whether it's misinformation, fake data or whatever. I can't find anything online. It would be nice to look at the data and the specifics. Because I honestly think a lot of people will have the wool being pulled over their eyes that this is the answer. I don't think this is the answer. You can go a lot of places and there can be a tower, gigantic and you're in a valley, you're not going to get a signal and you're not going to get your answers and all these people that are online saying I can't get a cell signal in my house, I live in a

dead zone, we need that tower. That may not be their answer, they may be living down in Nissequogue and they can't see that tower, but it's not going to help them. So, I would like to see the data and everything and make it available to everyone and not just hearsay online. I don't know where to get that information, it's not readily available online. So, if you could update your pages and give us links where we could look at the data then we could follow up with real specifics. But right now, everybody is just making statements and I don't think they're based on fact, they're based on opinion. Just take your cell phone and walk around the neighborhood and see where you drop signal. If it's a Verizon tower what's going to happen to people with AT&T are they going to get a signal? Yeah, maybe with 911 calls but not their regular signals that they really want. How many people use it for 911? Well, when you want it hopefully it will be there. So, if you could post the information, post links where we could see the information, it would be great. Right now, it's all a guessing game and hearsay.

SUPERVISOR WEHRHEIM: Thank you. I'll move to close the meeting.
